## WHAT IS THE ROLE?

- To be involved in the preparation, planning and delivery of holiday clubs x 3 per year

## WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

Our Holiday Clubs introduce children (most of whom don't go to church) to a fun and engaging faith where Jesus is a friend and they can enjoy him forever. We create an high-energy environment where many children feel love from us, with the goal of discovering God's love for them.

## WHAT ARE THE BEST THINGS ABOUT THE ROLE?

- Building links with families in our community
- Great team work
- Meeting and working with children and their parents who don't normally come to church.

## WHAT MINISTRY GIFTS & SKILLS DOES IT INVOLVE?

As this is a big operation, many different gifts are needed—here are just a few:

- Administration – being organised with crafts, games, ticketing or other activities
- Helps, such as setting up before and putting away after holiday club or running the sound desk
- Evangelism & talking to families after the holiday club
- Up-front speakers, puppeteers

## WHAT DO I DO SPECIFICALLY?

- For every holiday club there is a sign-up sheet with various roles needed. The bulk of what you do will be at the event itself, unless you are working with tickets or preparing crafts or food ahead of time.

## HOW MUCH TIME DOES IT INVOLVE AND WHEN?

- The holiday club happens 3 times a year (Good Friday; last Sunday in October or first Sunday in November; a Saturday before Christmas)
- The different roles require different amounts of time (specifically: planning team 2 x 2 hour meetings before each holiday club; Publicity & including ticket selling – probably about 4 – 6 hours in total; Organising crafts takes about 6 hours preparation; Organising activities: 2 – 4 hours preparation; Music team: Practice time
- All those helping on the day: usually about 4-6 hours

## HOW WILL I BE SUPPORTED?

- Organisers of each section are invited to a planning meeting. There are sometimes 2 planning meetings for each holiday club
- Jill Ward oversees this ministry with Sally Foulsham and a small team—they can assist you with questions.
